Frequently Asked Questions: RTC Pre-Summit Hill Day

1. When is the RTC Hill Day?

Wednesday, October 15, 2025. Meetings will take place between 9am and 5pm. Participants will receive detailed meeting schedules before October 15.

2. Which Members of Congress will we meet with?

The event will include a series of meetings with staff and/or members of the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate. We will target offices of members of Congress who serve on relevant committees, including House and Senate Energy, Science, and Finance. We will also consider the HQ and manufacturing locations of RTC Members and Solutions Providers and aim to secure meetings with offices where companies have a large footprint.

3. What will we discuss in the meetings?

The goal of these meetings is to introduce congressional staff to the RTC, provide information on thermal energy needs and technology solutions, and share Member and Solutions Provider perspectives on why it is important for the federal government to support renewable thermal energy solutions.

4. Will we have a chance to prepare?

Before the Hill Day, the RTC will provide virtual trainings to participants on key messages and how best to communicate their asks to elected officials. The RTC will also share talking points for participants to review before the Hill Day. During the Hill Day, RTC staff will lead each group to ensure Members and Solutions Providers feel comfortable and confident throughout the meetings.

5. How many people can I bring from my company? Can I bring people who are not attending the Summit?

You are welcome to invite colleagues within your company to join the Hill Day, regardless of whether they are attending the Summit, but we are limiting participation to a maximum of three participants per company. If more than one company representative participates, we will divide them into separate groups to allow each company maximum exposure with congressional offices. Total attendance will be capped at 50 participants, and we will maintain a waitlist for anyone else who may be interested.
